Visiting Researchers

The Food Security Center (FSC) is a newly established university center of excellence in development collaboration at the University of Hohenheim, Stuttgart, Germany. FSC is one of five excellence centers of the program "exceed – Higher Education Excellence in Development Cooperation," which is supported by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) with funds of the Federal Ministry of Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) of Germany. FSC's mission is to make effective and innovative scientific contributions in research, teaching, and policy advice to eradicate hunger and achieve food security in collaboration with partner Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in Africa, Asia, and Latin America and national and international development organizations. Thematically, FSC's activities deal with issues of (sustainable) food availability, (economic) food access, food use, and food utilization. More information is available from www.foodsecurity.de.

Job summary

FSC and its collaboration partners seek two visiting researcher from a developing country for a fixed-term appointment of three to twelve month, starting November 2009. The center wishes to attract young innovative professionals. The successful candidates will collaborate with the research staff of FSC's partner universities, research centers, or development organizations located in developing countries to conduct a specific research project contributing to FSC's mission. Objective of the collaborations is at least one joint, peer-reviewed publication. Interregional South-South collaborations are encouraged in particular. Candidates should present their research work in the partners' seminars, lecture series, and/or workshops. They might be also expected to engage in research topic related teaching and training activities of the partner institution at graduate and postgraduate level on a limited scale. Furthermore, FSC and its partners aim at establishing an active, long-lasting collaboration with the researchers and their home institutions. The positions are based at the partner institutions in developing countries. The monthly grant equals a net amount of 600 Euros in 2009 and 700 Euros in 2010. Travel costs to/from the positions' locations will be covered. Health insurance and other potential costs must be paid privately.

Required skills

- PhD degree in agricultural, nutritional, natural, social, economic, or political sciences or related disciplines with specification on food security related issues
- Nationality of a developing country according to DAC list
- Excellence in oral and written English language
- Ability to conduct innovative research

- Excellent interpersonal skills and team spirit
- Ability to work well in an interdisciplinary, multicultural environment and with individuals from different scientific, societal, and cultural backgrounds and organizations from the public, private, and civil society sector

Please submit cover letter (specifying your preferred duration of stay at FSC's partner institution), detailed resume, proposal (maximum 1000 words) specifying your planned research and teaching/training activities during your stay (including type of publications to be completed and possible workshop/lecture/short course topics), summary of PhD thesis (maximum 1000 words), and two letters of references to fsc@uni-hohenheim.de. The proposal must be developed in collaboration with and formally agreed by the supervisor at FSC's partner institution. Deadline for application is October 15, 2009 (12 pm CET).
